


St. Vincent de Paul, Patron Saint of Charitable Societies

The deathbed confession of a dying servant opened Vincent de Paul's eyes to the spiritual needs of the peasantry of France.

The Countess de Gondi—whose servant he had helped—persuaded her husband to endow missionaries to work among poor tenant farmers and country people.

After working in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, Vincent returned to lead the Congregation of the Mission or the Vincentians. These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience and stability, devoted themselves entirely to people in smaller towns and villages.

Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. With the help



of the Daughters of Charity, he organized the wealthy of Paris to collect funds for missionary projects and founded hospitals.

Although he had an "irascible" temperament, he became a tender and affectionate man, very sensitive to the needs of others.

Pope Leo XIII made him the patron of all charitable societies. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded in 1833 to help the impoverished who lived in Paris slums.

Today, the organization has nearly a million members in 140 countries. The group operates thrift shops in which proceeds benefit the poor.

St. Vincent de Paul (1580-1660) dedicated his life to serve the poor. He is celebrated on Sept. 27.
