

Pope Francis proclaims "Year of St. Joseph"

The Holy Father marked the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church by declaring the Year of St. Joseph through Dec. 8, 2021.

Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

St. Joseph "concretely expressed his fatherhood" by making an offering of himself in love "a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home," writes Pope Francis, quoting St Paul VI.

The Holy Father offers to us a prayer to St. Joseph:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you, Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

First Reading
