In Catholic European countries. Father's Day has been celebrated on March 19, the feast day of St. Joseph, since the Middle Ages. Many also honor their parish priest - the spiritual father - as well as their own parent.

The U.S. has marked dad's special day as the third Sunday in June since 1910.

It has been suggested that the honor began when Sonora Smart Dodd and her five brothers attended a Mother's Day ceremony in church. The siblings had been raised by a single father and looked to appreciate the role of their dad and others. She chose June 5 – her father's birthday.

Measures to create a national holiday failed in 1913 and again in 1966. It finally passed in 1972.

There is speculation about why Mother's Day originated in 1914, but the same sentiment did not catch on for dads: business! Moms enjoyed flowers, candy, cards and gifts, and it brought in revenue to many shops. Unfortunately, dads just did not generate the business then.

So, give a gift, buy a card or cook a meal. Tell your dad or father figure how important he is, and the difference he made in your life. Spend the day – grilling, boating, playing ball or just talking.
