2021 Croatian Festival Wrap-Up

The 2021 Croatian Festival netted **\$68,760** for our parish.

Despite the light crowd, this is the most money ever made by our century-old social!

In comparison, the 2019 total was \$61,590. In 2020, even with no festival, we brought in \$43,395.

We are pleased - and awestruck - by this wonderful news. Our festival has grown by leaps and bounds - and has become an event that draws crowds from beyond our little parish.

Interestingly, only one-third of the funds (\$18,005) raised came from sales on the night of the festival. The other two-thirds (\$50,755) of the church proceeds came in advance from sponsorships and raffles.

This year's profit included: \$34,060 from Support St. John's sponsorships; \$12,400 from the 50/50 Mini and Maxi Raffles; \$4,295 from the Money Raffle; and \$18,005 from the night of the festival, including prize

Sweet, sweet memories

Down the metal stairs we went, forming a line that curled around the St. John's cafeteria. Girls first, then boys – genders always separated.

After passing the stage, we reached a little fridge that held tiny cartons of milk. Sometimes, there was even chocolate milk – what a treat!

The line glided into the kitchen where we were greeted by the "cafeteria ladies." We remember their smiling faces — Mrs. Reynolds, Mrs. McKinney, Mrs. Horvat and so many lovely women who were dedicated to making a hot lunch every day for the students.

In those days, there was no weekly menu posted online or shared in the school newsletter (because we did not have a newsletter!)

Our meal was a surprise. Was it hamburger day – or hot dogs? Maybe sliced beef with mashed potatoes and gravy. Every day, there was homemade buns or bread that scented the building.

On Fridays, the meal was vegetarian because meat was

prohibited. Tomato soup and grilled cheese. Fish sticks. Mac and cheese.

Our food was served on sectioned trays. There was a slot for silverware and one for milk, with squares for the main course, dessert, fruit and vegetable.

We had one meal choice each day

– the cost in the early 1960s was 50
cents. If you did not care for the food,
you could bring a sack lunch and buy
milk for 2 cents.

Each grade had a designated table. And like good Catholic children, we all pretty much sat in the same seat every day. The eighth-graders — big kids on campus — were assigned to sit at the head of the tables with the younger children. It was considered an honor.

After finishing our lunch, we would clean up our place by dumping the trash and returning our tray to be washed for the next day.

Then it was recess and time for a few minutes of freedom. Except for the coldest of days, we headed outside to run, play and talk.
