With Sincere Condolences - Frances Granahan

We are saddened to hear of the loss of Frances Granahan, who died on Nov. 4. She was 85.

Frances grew up in the Strawberry Hill neighborhood and attended St. John the Baptist School and Bishop Ward High School.

She majored in elementary education at St. Mary's College, became a member of the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth and taught elementary school. She studied Spanish and became fluent in the language, allowing her

to serve as a missionary in Peru and Guatemala.

After leaving the Sisters of Charity community, she graduated with a political science degree from American University in Washington, D.C. She worked for the U.S. House of Representatives, Texas Eastern Corporation and Panhandle Easter Corporation.

Fran and her husband, Jim, lived in New Jersey after retirement. After his death in 2017, she returned to Kansas City, KS, to be closer to family and friends.

Survivors include her brother, Edward Turk, and nieces and nephews. Preceding her in death were her husband, parents, Matthew and Louise Turk; sisters Helen Verbeck, Emily Novak, and Bette Calevich; and brother Raymond Turk.

A Mass of Christian Burial is scheduled on Monday, Nov. 8 at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church. Visitation will be at 9 a.m. in the church. A private burial is planned at a later date in Pennsylvania.



A sweet memory.....

Monsignor Martin Davorin Krmpotic, the first permanent pastor of St. John the Baptist Church, sits on the front porch of the rectory.

Much of the porch was eliminated later when it was enclosed for the parish office and additional room on the second floor.

He came to Kansas City from Croatia in 1902 to serve 50 families on Strawberry Hill. The Monsignor guided the building and development of the church, school and orphanage until his death in 1931.

Sit right down and remember how it felt to watch mom and dad bowl. Yes! These were the very benches they sat upon while waiting for their turn.


