

Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann has opened the annual Call to Share. This fundraising drive serves 181,000 Catholics and 107 parishes in nearly 13,000 square miles of Northeast Kansas who are in need of prayer and healing, physical and spiritual comfort.

This year's goal is to raise \$6.5 million. These proceeds will support 43 ministries and programs, including:

- Strengthening Catholic education, faith formation, and campus ministry;
- Reaching thousands of people through Pro-Life and Foster Care Ministry outreach programs;
- Working with parishes to develop Catholic leaders and missionary disciples of Jesus;
- Supporting the formation of our seminarians, priests, and deacons; and
- Funding emergency requests from our parishes and schools.

When the school was originally built, the younger children used the 9,000-square-foot roof for a playground.

According to a Kansas City Star article, dated Aug. 18, 1929, the rooftop would be a safe place to play without the concern of traffic. A plan was in place to install playground equipment. Stairs by the front entrance provided access to the top.
