

# Keeping In Touch

As I write this, I am getting ready to head back home from Cleveland, OH where I have been for the past week at the Canon Law Convention. It has been a great and busy week. The week has been filled with presentations on various aspects of law dealing with marriage cases, religious life, the keeping of sacramental records, sexual abuse, gender identity and its canonical implications, the reform and renewal of offices at the Holy See, laws that have changed, and much more. The opening keynote address was given by Bishop Robert Barron on the Synodality process that the Church is undertaking at the moment. All the presentations have been very good and informative. In addition to attending sessions there are also meetings that take place for various committees and groupings within the Canon Law Society. I had to attend the meeting of the Judicial Vicars and I am also part of the Convention planning committee dealing with liturgy. This means that I had to help with the planning of the liturgies for the week. One might think that it would not be a lot but it is. Our meetings are at a hotel so we have to take a room that the hotel gives to us and transform it into a sacred space (chapel). In order to do this, we have work with the local Diocese because we need to borrow many things to do this. In addition to creating this chapel in the hotel we have to get people to help read, be Eucharistic Ministers, help take up the collection (yes, we take up a collection ... this year the collection was taken up for the Diocese of Cleveland to help Ukrainian refugees ... the collection from the Mass was over \$2000), play and cantor, serve, and preside. Even though it is a lot of work it has been a blessing to serve in this capacity. Another blessing of these past days has been seeing and reconnecting with fellow canon lawyers. This year we had canon lawyers attending from USA, Canada, Italy, Germany, Ireland, Australia, and elsewhere. Whether it was getting caught up with a friend you have not seen in a while or continuing a discussion about something that was presented in one of the sessions or a combination of both it was a great blessing! As I hope you can tell from the above, the past week has been a very good one and a great blessing. Having said that I am very much looking forward to being home and seeing you all!
