



Berniece M. Novosel passed away Monday, November 7, 2022 at the Rose Estates, in Overland Park, Ks. Funeral service will be at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, 708 N 4th December 1, 2022. Predeceasing her were her parents, her sisters Anne R. Spehar, Mary K. Novak, Mildred A. Nicholson, and brother Joseph A.
