

Our Mother of Consolation

September 4

When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing near the Cross, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother."-
Iohn 19: 26-27

With these words Jesus was asking his Church, represented by the disciple, to console and care for his mother. At the same time he was asking his mother to console and care for the Church. From this arose the tradition that Mary, the mother of Jesus, is a source of consolation for the whole Church.

Monica, the mother of Augustine, suffered much from her wayward son's early life of sin. According to an ancient story, she confided her distress to Mary, who appeared to Monica wearing a leather cincture (a type of belt). As a pledge of her support, Mary removed the cincture and gave it to Monica to wear. Monica gave it to her son, who, after his conversion to Christ, gave it to the members of his monastic community.

The traditional depiction of Our Mother of Consolation shows Mary holding the child Jesus on her lap. Jesus and Mary both hold the Augustinian cincture in their hands.

Devotion to the mother of Jesus under the title Mother of Consolation has been an Augustinian tradition for centuries, since the cincture that is part of the Augustinian habit reminds them of the compassionate consolation she offers to the Church.

September is Hunger Action Month The USDA defines food insecurity as a lack of consistent access to enough food for every person in a household to live an active, healthy life. This can be a temporary situation for a family or can last a long time. Food insecurity is one way we measure how many people cannot afford food. More than 34 million people, including 10 million children experience food insecurity in the United States. Nearly one in five Kansas children do not have enough food to eat. Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas is committed to addressing hunger and food insecurity through many solutions. When families come to Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas, we connect them to Federal Nutrition Programs such as WIC and SNAP. Both of these programs allow families to purchase nutritious food for their families. Catholic Charities also administers CACFP and Summer Food programs, which provide nutritious meals and snacks to children when not in school. We also distribute commodities in Topeka and Wyandotte County and we distribute senior commodities in Leavenworth, Lawrence and Seneca. All of these programs are federally funded food. Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas operates eight food pantries in our 21 county service area. We strive to provide healthy food to families in need as a way to supplement their household food budget. Following the pandemic and with the rising cost of food we have seen a 69% increase in people accessing our food pantries. We have had a saying at Catholic Charities "school's out, food's out" and that has certainly been true this past summer. Our shelves are close to empty and we are not replacing our inventory at a rate that keeps adequate food on the shelves. We continue to purchase food but there is limited bulk to purchase and just like everyone, our dollar is not going as far. We depend on our parish and community food drives to keep us stocked with shelf stable food and donations have decreased this summer. We need your help! 



There will be additional items for raffle the day of the event and we invite everyone to come to **Sunflower Hills Golf Course** to see what wonderful raffle prizes we have.


