The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God.

As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Keeping In Touch

Time is moving quickly – here we are at the 2nd Sunday of Advent! This past week and in the week to come we have celebrations in honor of Our Lady that are important for us. In one sense any celebration in honor of Our Lady is important, however, these two celebrations have a significance for us. On December 8 we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is not only a Holy Day of Obligation (meaning that we are bound to attend Mass that day and if we don't it is sinful) but it is also the patronal feast for the United States. In this feast we recall that Mary was conceived without sin preparing her for becoming the Mother of God! The second is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. While this day is not a Holy Day of Obligation, it is an important day for us because it is under this title of Our Lady that she is declared patroness of the Americas and Protectress of Unborn Children. In this title we recall

how Our Lady appeared in Mexico. As we honor Our Lady under these two titles, let us draw closer to her as she always leads us to her Son Jesus.



Božićna Pšenica/Christmas Wheat

In Croatia and in other Eastern European nations, wheat is planted on *December* 13, **St. Lucy's Feast Day**. This ancient tradition dates back to the time when agriculture was Croatia's main industry and serves as a symbol of fertility, new life, and renewal. Also, while testing the viability of the seed, the sprouted wheat is a predictor of sorts: if the wheat grows dense, tall, and lush, the next year will be



fruitful and successful. In some parts of Croatia, people observe the growing wheat each day until Christmas. It is believed that the weather of each month in the upcoming year will mirror the weather on each of the days in the period from Sveta Lucija, St, Lucy's Day, to Christmas.

Plant wheat in a small dish, bowl, or small pot of soil and keep it lightly watered. By Christmas the sprouted wheat will be tall enough to be decorated with the *hrvatska trobojnica* (Croatian tricolor) around the wheat. The tricolor is a ribbon with red, white, and blue stripes. Place it near the Nativity where it will remind all that Christ, the Bread of Life, was born in Bethlehem, whose name means "House of Bread." The wheat recalls the Eucharist which is made from wheat and brings to mind Christ's parables about wheat.

The Croatian custom of growing St. Lucy's or Christmas wheat, *Božićna Pšenica*, was revived by deceased parishioner Matthew B. Thomas and has become tradition at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church. It continues as such and is carried on in his honor by his loving siblings Ivana Morris and George Thomas. Seed packets are available at each church exit; take a packet or two and keep the tradition growing.
