Welcome, Advent. Prepare the Way

Today begins the Advent season which prepares us for the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day. The name derives from the Latin verb "ven," meaning to come. Certainly, the days will be filled with shopping, baking, wrapping presents, cooking and spending time with family and friends. But let us always remember the true meaning of the season. One Catholic tradition is the nightly lighting of an Advent wreath at the evening meal.

The History


The Advent wreath dates back to the 16th Century but the modern version was evolved 300 years later. Johann Hinrich Wichern, a German Lutheran, created a wreath to help children understand the passage of time. Using an old cart wheel decorated with evergreens, he placed white candles for each Sunday with red ones in between. As the children lit a new candle, they could easily see how close they were to celebrating the birth of Christ. The materials were like what was easily available, but the wreath does represent Catholic symbolism. The circle shape is thought to show Christ's eternal presence. Evergreens symbolize life in the Catholic faith. Candles mean "amen" and the flame shows Christ as the Light of the World.

The Wreath

An Advent wreath has many looks. It may still resemble Wichern's, but typically uses three purple candles plus a rose or pink one. Some have a fifth white candles. (Source: stmagdalen.org.) Purple candles represent prayer, penance and preparatory sacrifice – all to remind us of how we should prepare during the weeks before Christmas. The pink candle, lit on the third or Gaudate Sunday, means to rejoice. The optional white candle is the Christ candle for purity.

Lighting The Candles

On the first night of Advent, you will bless the Advent wreath. This is followed by a prayer which changes weekly. Candles are lit in the following order: For the first week of Advent, light one purple candle. During second week of Advent, light two purple candles. U When you reach the third week of Advent (traditionally called Gaudete Sunday), light two purple candles and one rose (pink) candle. During the fourth week, light all four candles. If you use a white candle in the center, it is lit on Christmas Eve.



Božićna Pšenica/Christmas Wheat


In Croatia and in other Eastern European nations, wheat is planted on *December 13*, St. Lucy's Feast Day. This ancient tradition dates back to the time when agriculture was Croatia's main industry and serves as a symbol of fertility, new life, and renewal. Also, while testing the viability of the seed, the sprouted wheat is a predictor of sorts: if the wheat grows dense, tall, and lush, the next year will be fruitful and successful. In some parts of




Croatia, people observe the growing wheat each day until Christmas. It is believed that the weather of each month in the upcoming year will mirror the weather on each of the days in the period from Sveta Lucija, St, Lucy's Day, to Christmas.

Plant wheat in a small dish, bowl, or small pot of soil and keep it lightly watered. By Christmas the sprouted wheat will be tall enough to be decorated with the *hrvatska trobojnica* (Croatian tricolor) around the wheat. The tricolor is a ribbon with red, white, and blue stripes. Place it near the Nativity where it will remind all that Christ, the Bread of Life, was born in Bethlehem, whose name means "House of Bread." The wheat recalls the Eucharist which is made from wheat and brings to mind Christ's parables about wheat.

The Croatian custom of growing St. Lucy's or Christmas wheat, *Božićna Pšenica*, was revived by deceased parishioner **Matthew B. Thomas** and has become tradition at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church. It continues as such and is carried on in his honor by his loving siblings **Ivana Morris** and **George Thomas**. Seed packets are available at each church exit; take a packet or two and keep the tradition growing.



If anyone is interested in serving as a Sacristan in 2024 for our Saturday or Sunday Masses, please contact the church office. The time commitment is one hour before Mass preparing the church and altar and about 20 minutes after Mass. Training and written instructions will be provided.


