Andjelka J. Radmilic-Jackson

Keeping In Touch

Over the last little while, there has been a discussion amongst the priests about the structure of the diocese. For a number of years now, the diocese has been broken up into regions. Each region was led by a priest elected by the of the region. Here in the WYCO region, I was elected the Region Leader. The discussions over the last little while have led the Archbishop to put into place a system that is outlined in the Code of Canon Law called Deaneries. This means that we are now referred to as the WYCO Deanery and the priest who leads the Deanery and is referred to as the Dean is appointed by the Archbishop. I have been appointed by the Archbishop as the Dean for the WYCO Deanery. This past week all of the new deans gathered with the Archbishop to take our Oath of Office. During the ceremony we make a Proclamation of Faith and swear to uphold the teachings of the church and to foster communion and unity within the deanery. It was a very powerful moment for me.

I am reminded of the responsibility that has been entrusted to me and I pray that I may be faithful to this responsibility. I would ask that you would please pray for me that I may faithfully and effectively foster the faith in word and action in this deanery and that I may be a support and guide for the other priests in the community.


