In the midst of the busyness of the coming week, there is one thing that stands out for me and I am looking forward to. On Wednesday, April 24 we celebrate the Conversion of St. Augustine. This is a big celebration in the Augustinian world. We recall how Augustine was living a life not in accord with God, but he was searching and in his searching he found God.

While conversion is indeed a life-long process, there is a moment where it begins for Augustine. This happens in the year of 386. He was visiting with a friend and they were outside. There were children singing a song which said, "pick it up and read it, pick it up and read it."

While at first he thought this was just children playing, he began to wonder if this song might be a command from God. He picked up a bible and opened it up. His eyes fell upon a passage from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans where it says, "not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual excess and lust, not in quarrelling and jealousy. Rather, put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the desire of the flesh."

In this moment Augustine felt as if his heart was flooded with light and he abandoned his sinful ways and turned to God. As we celebrate the Conversion of Augustine with great gratitude, we seek to listen for the ways in which God is calling us closer to Himself.



On Friday, April 26, you are invited to join Archbishop Naumann, who will offer Mass in atonement for the harm resulting from sexual abuse in the Catholic Church. This scandal has left victims with lasting wounds, and has caused people to mistrust the Church.

This Mass is open to all who want to support and pray for healing for victims, and for the integrity of our clergy. Immediately after Mass there will be a short information session about abuse, and how the Archdiocese cares for victims using Restorative Justice principals. Then a reception will follow for conversation and fellowship. Resources will be available for all who are interested in this topic.






